What is EIS - Eastman Immigrant Services

The Eastman Immigrant Services (EIS) aims to assist new immigrants settling in the area. The program works to make initial settlement a rewarding experience for newcomers in Southeastern Manitoba.

EIS services include:

1. Reception and orientation;
2. Language referrals;
3. Special events and activities;
4. Access to community resources, and
5. Employment and career counseling and referrals.

EIS Services

1. Reception and orientation services such as school registration, obtaining Social Insurance Number (SIN) card, registering for Child Tax Benefits and with Manitoba Health.
2. Information on immigration to Southeastern Manitoba and referrals to services.
3. Translation and interpretation services for newcomers.
4. Employment related services such as assisting with resumé writing, job search, pre-employment counseling, career coaching and assistance with occupation and credential recognition.
5. Programs which include multicultural events, such as participation in the Pioneer Days parade, annual newcomers picnic, winter events, and information sessions.
6. The Resource Center offers written materials for settlement related issues, a lending library, audio-visual as well as public computer for job search.

Employment

One of the basic, but most important needs new immigrants have is to find rewarding employment. Our Employment Facilitator and Career Coach will assist newcomers in addressing employment related needs.

Employment preparation services include:

1. Employment counseling and skills identification;
2. Assistance with resumé preparation and job applications;
3. An introduction to interview techniques; and
4. Information and assistance on how to get your career recognized in Manitoba and assistance with identifying career goals and how to achieve these goals is offered.
